Essay Contest (K-8)	Spelling Bee (1-8)
Math Bee (1-8)	Craft Project (K-4)

General Rules:

1. Each participant **must** be a resident of Walker County and under age 19.
2. All entries must be the work of the participant and may be exhibited by the entrant only.
3. The entry fee for each event is \$1.00 (one dollar).
4. A first, second, and third place trophy will be awarded in each category in each event. U.S. Savings Bonds will be given to the first place winner of each event. Participation ribbons will be given as additional prizes.
5. Exhibits will be watched and every precaution taken to protect all exhibits, but in no case will the Walker County Fair Association be held responsible for damage, theft, or breakage to entries.
6. The division chairman retains the right to combine classes in the event of an insufficient number of entries in a class, or to create a class or classes if deemed necessary.
7. Entries are limited to the first 30 participants to sign up per category.
8. The Spelling Bee, Math Bee, Craft Contest, and displaying of Essays will be Sunday, March 27, 2011 beginning at 2:00 p.m.
9. All participants and visitors must enter through the front door of the main building at the Walker County Fairgrounds. If you wish to visit other parts of the fairgrounds, you will be required to pay admission.
10. If a participant has pre-registered, they must check in at the pre-registration table between 1:00 – 2:00 p.m., Sunday, March 27, 2011.
11. Awards will be given during the awards ceremony at the conclusion of all events of the Academic Rodeo.

2011 Academic Rodeo Essay Contest Grades K-8

Essay Rules

1. Each entrant must handwrite his or her essay.
2. Each entrant may enter only one essay.
3. Entrant's name, address, telephone number, school and grade level **must** be included on the essay.
4. Entries must be postmarked by **March 18, 2011 to:**

5. Essays will be on display during the Academic Rodeo event. Students may claim their essay that night. Any unclaimed essay will be mailed to your child's school.

Lengths

- K – 2nd – 150 words or less
3rd – 4th – 300 words or less
5th – 8th – 400 words or less

Categories for Competition

For each of the following grades, students will compete only with other students in that grade category. The categories are: K, 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th, 5th – 6th, and 7th – 8th

Essay Topics Big Dreams in a Small town

Grades K-5 – Describe your favorite place in Walker County.

Grades 6-8 – Discuss the kind of dreams you have for our small town -Walker County. (What would you like to see happen here in the future?)

Judging

Papers will be judged on correct English usage, grammar, and how well the essay topic is answered.

2011 Craft Project Grades K-4

Participants will create a craft project, design, or exhibit depicting their favorite place in Walker County. The project should be constructed solely out of recyclable materials.

General Rules:

1. Contest is limited to the first 30 entries per grade level.
2. Pre-Registration forms must be postmarked by March 18, 2011 and mailed to:

3. Participants must deliver projects to the Main Building of the Walker County Fairgrounds between 1:00 – 2:00 p.m. on Sunday, March 27, 2011. Late projects will not be accepted.
4. Projects that receive a first-sixth place ribbon will be on display throughout the fair. All other projects will need to be claimed following the contest on the night of the event. Please make arrangements to remain at the event until awards are announced or have someone claim your project. The fair is not responsible for unclaimed projects. Projects that are held for display may be picked up immediately following the freezer sale on Saturday, April 2, 2011.

Guidelines:

1. Projects must not be larger than 2ft. high, 2 ft. wide and 2ft. deep.
2. Projects may either be two- or three-dimensional.
3. All materials used must be **recyclable**. Please attach list of items and how you acquired them as a recyclable item.
4. Entries may be enhanced with materials such as glitter, paint, chalk, crayon, etc. (Please keep extras "simple".)
5. Projects will be judged on creativity, originality, imagination, and presentation. Winners will be selected at each individual grade level.
6. Students should label their entries with name and grade level by placing a 4" x 6" index card on the back of their project in the bottom left corner. This is the only place that this information should be visible.

Spelling Bee Rules Grades 1-8

General Rules

Words will be taken from the lists provided; however, to avoid ties, up to 20% of the words may also be taken from state textbooks adopted for grades competing in that division, or words of common usage.

Competition Rules:

1. Contest is limited to the first 30 entries per category.
2. All words will be printed.
3. You may ask for a definition of the word.
4. You may ask for the word to be used in a sentence.
5. These requests will be granted until the judges agree that the word has been made reasonably clear to the spellers.
6. Judges are in control of the competition. Their decision is final.

Math Bee Rules Grades 1-8

1. Contest is limited to the first 30 entries per category.
2. Participants will be given a maximum of one hour to complete their entry. However, in the event of a tie, the first correct entry turned in will be the winner.
3. All scratch work must be completed on the test booklet.
4. No electronic devices will be used.
5. Judges are in control of the competition. Their decision is final.
