

## 2012 SUPERVISED PROJECT SHOW RULES

1. The Supervised Project Show Division will be open to any Walker County youth currently enrolled in a Career and Technology program and/or a member in good standing of FFA or who is an active member of an organized 4-H Club.
2. A project can be exhibited only one time at the Walker County Fair Supervised Project Show and must have been constructed within one calendar year of the exhibition date.
3. All projects must be painted or properly treated and must be clean and in a presentable condition even though they may have been used.
4. Each project entered must be accompanied by a statement from a Career and Technology teacher or adult 4-H leader certifying that the project was planned and constructed under his or her supervision.
5. All entries must be received by the Walker County Fair Association by 5:00 p.m. Friday, two weeks before the Fair begins. The entry deadline date is listed in the Walker County Fair Schedule of Events for the current year.
6. All trailers and other projects, including trailer-mounted bar-b-que pits, must meet current Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) regulations. All towed projects are to be equipped with safety chains.
7. Appropriate and safe display stands must be provided for gates, panels, and other projects that need support. Sharp edges and points, such as found on self-feeder roofs, bale movers, etc. are to be padded or covered as necessary to prevent injury.
8. Entries must be delivered and registered at the Walker County Fair Grounds on the Friday designated in the current Walker County Fair Schedule of Events between 8:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. Judging will begin at 1:00 p.m. the following Monday.
9. All projects are to be identified with standard club exhibitor cards or computer generated cards that include the exhibitor name(s), chapter/club, and school.
10. No "For Sale" signs will be permitted on projects.
11. Exhibitors are to keep the projects and exhibit area clean and orderly. A showmanship award will be presented to the chapter/club that does the best job of presenting a good public image. An individual showmanship award will be presented to the individual(s) who do the best job of presenting a project to the judges.
12. Entries will be classified by the Danish System (blue, red, or white) using the following score card:

A. General Appearance and Workmanship	40 points
B. Design and Materials Used	20 points
C. Practicality	20 points
D. Degree of Difficulty and Presentation	10 points

E. Appropriate Finish

13. The first and second place entries in each division will be eligible to sell in the Supervised Projects Sale, if they receive a blue ribbon. A commission fee of 8% of all sale proceeds will be deducted for the WCFA. One hundred dollars will be withheld by WCFA from the sale price of any project when a parent or designated adult 21 years of age or older has not completed the two hour work requirement. Career and technology teacher supervised activities, as assigned by WCFA Officials and completed by students in classes or as club sponsored supervised activities, may be used to meet the six hour per exhibitor work requirement before the Fair. This does not apply to the two hour cleanup requirement following the Fair that applies to all exhibitors who sell projects. All exhibitors of Supervised Projects will adhere to the General Rules as listed in the Livestock section in the current Walker County Fair catalog.

14. All judge's decisions and announced results will be final.

15. Every precaution will be taken to protect projects entered, however, the Walker County Fair Association and the officials of the Supervised Project Show Division will not be responsible for and losses or damage to projects.

16. Entries must be removed from the Walker County Fairgrounds on the last Sunday of the Fair between 7 a.m. and 9 a.m. No entries are to be removed before the scheduled move-out date and time. The move-out date for this year's Fair is listed in the Walker County Fair Schedule of Events. Any exhibit remaining on display after the deadline will become property of the Walker County Fair Association.

17. Projects may be entered in the following divisions:

DIVISION I-Metal Working  
DIVISION III-Woodworking Indoors  
DIVISION V-Livestock Equipment  
DIVISION VII-Trailers

DIVISION II-Woodworking Outdoors  
DIVISION IV-Refurbished\*  
DIVISION VI-Agricultural Equipment  
DIVISION VIII-Wildlife

\*The top two projects entered in the Refurbished Divisions will receive merchandise awards in lieu of being included in the Supervised Projects Sale.

Note: The number of divisions will not be increased, but the division titles may be changed to reflect current year entries.
